



Reading comprehension includes both literary and informational passages. The questions focus on identifying, interpreting, analyzing, and extending information in passages





#### Science - % Proficient




## **2016-2017 FAST Assessment Results**

The FAST Assessment is an early literacy assessment that is implemented in the fall, winter, and spring. Keokuk CSD utilizes FAST CBMR which a measures a student's word reading efficiency. Students who are able to read a grade-level passage with efficiency are better able to use their cognitive resources to comprehend while reading. The data from the FAST assessment is utilized to support data based decisions by our teachers with in the skill development within the foundations of reading.



# **Graduation Rate**

With a focus on meeting the student academic needs through a Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) Keokuk CSD has seen a steady increase in our graduation rate since the 2015-2016 to the 2016-2017 school year.



## **Behavior Referral Data**
